

Tomanamus Forest – Muckleshoot Federal Corporation

Program: *Muckleshoot Federal Stewardship Youth Corps*

Position: *Stewardship Youth Corps Supervisor*

Pay: *\$17.50/hr. work week is 40 hours; 4 days/week, 10hrs/day*

Location: *Tomanamus Forest*

General Directive:

The program purpose is to provide positive work experience for Muckleshoot youth in the fields of Forest engineering, Forestry, and Wildlife from a working forest perspective during summer break 6/20-8/24. This position will be supervising three youth crews, made up of 5-9 members and 1 crew lead. This position will ensure crews understand their scope of work for each day, how to complete it, maintain safety for all crew members at all times, and report to SSCII and HFM leadership support staff.

Scope:

- Program is setup to provide a pathway for learning critical thinking, stewardship, and natural resource skills on the job.
- Primary goals for the participants is to promote further studies or careers for Muckleshoot youth who may wish to follow a natural resource career path.

Duties:

- Provide leadership and management of 3 youth crews, consisting of 1 crew lead and 5-9 crew members.
- Responsible for safety orientated work practices of self and crew.
- On a daily basis promoting a safety first environment through instilling, maintaining, and reviewing safety practices with crew members.
- Oversee safety and transportation of crew to project sites.
- Supervision of crews on a variety of projects including riparian enhancement, eradicate invasive & noxious weeds, maintaining roads and ditches, repair & rebuild campsites, improve wildlife habitat.
- Supervise crews on projects that will preserve MFC lands, environment, and enhance safety on the property.
- Learn from forestry field experiences with forest industry professionals and share technical forestry skills and applications.
- Other duties as assigned

Requirements:

- Leader who can successfully manage 24 youth (16-20)
- Must have or be obtaining a degree in natural resource career field, or have demonstrated experience in natural resource management
- Must be a safety minded individual.
- Must be mature and able to oversee the daily safety and leadership/management of crew.
- Looking for an individual who enjoys the outdoors and has a passion for nature.
- Individual must be comfortable with working in the woods and being exposed to changing weather and difficult environmental working conditions.
- Be willing and able to work hard and participate in most work projects.
- Team player, be able to understand and work with other's needs and with different personalities
